

Implementing the LLL Concept in SNA countries

WP3: Capacity Building for LLL Centre & Teaching Staff

1. Description of the WP3

This WP builds capacity for subsequent activities. By training staff members and providing them with the means to replicate such know-how, LLL centres and teaching staff become better prepared. The aim is to plan and implement training actions to update horizontal competences of LLL staff, and provide them with know-how to train teaching staff for future course development. The WP will use both training and a 'train the trainers' approach to replicate knowledge.

2. Training Plan

During the Activity 3.1, responsible partner will create the Training Plan for LLL Horizontal Competences with the objective to update the skills of LLL staff for new challenges. In parallel a set of 3 Train the Trainers module will be developed to pass knowledge onto academic profile staff via LLL Centre staff. The training plan will be divided into 6 following modules:

3. Development of training content and materials

Training plans will incorporate pedagogical methodologies, expected topics and syllabus, and profiles of learners for a selection process. Plans will be virtually disseminated and referred to workshop design, as well as being updated where appropriate via evaluation feedback.

For both sets of training exercises (Horizontal Competences and Train the Trainer Workshop), comprehensive training materials will be developed. As 3.5 in particular has as its objective the replication of such training, materials will include complete teacher's notes. Training materials will be developed to be user-friendly and highly practical, based on a notion of participation and making full use of case studies and interactive sessions. Training materials will be available and transferable virtually.

4. Pilot workshops per HEI for Teaching Staff

LLL Centre staff will utilise the knowledge and materials gathered in D3.4 to train academic staff in their home institution on the 3 topics (Pedagogical Methodologies, Flexible Learning and Course Design for Accreditation). Each workshop is expected to be imparted to minimum 15 academic staff (45 per institution) for 1 day each. The aim of such workshops is to multiply knowledge for LLL and provide a better linkage between LLL Centres, faculty and courses.

5. Evaluation Results

Evaluation tools will be produced in WP 8, Quality, but are highly relevant for the improvement and modification of training materials, in particular between activities 3.5 and 3.6. Therefore, these results will be collated into a report. Each EU partner will be responsable for collecting the quality Assurance questionnaires at the beginning and at the end of the training workshops.
